

Welcome to Watchmen Arise!

We're so glad you're joining us for Watchmen Arise. Over these ten days leading up to Pentecost Sunday, may your heart be stirred, your prayers empowered, and your love for Israel and the Jewish people deepened as we journey together.

Why a Prayer Guide for Israel?

As Missions advocates and prayer leaders, the critical need for intercession for the Jewish people has become increasingly evident. Israel holds a central role in God's redemptive plan, yet many Jewish people remain unreached by the Gospel. Despite Israel's prominence in Scripture, the Jewish population, both in Israel and the diaspora, continues to require our focused prayer.

There are approximately 15 million Jews worldwide, with 6 million residing in Israel. However, only about 1% of the Jewish population identifies as Messianic believers. According to Joshua Project, over 5 million Jews in Israel remain unreached, with many others in Jewish communities around the world still waiting to hear the message of salvation.

In Romans 10:1, Paul expressed his heart's desire for Israel's salvation:

"Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved."

This call to prayer resonates deeply within parts of the Church today, while other parts are awakening to this call. The power of intercession has proven to bring breakthroughs in areas long considered spiritually hard. Israel, despite its history and significance, remains in desperate need of the Gospel.

Rejoicing is found in the fact that the number of Messianic Jews in Israel has grown from a handful in the early 1970s to some 30,000 believers today.

This prayer guide aims to engage believers in focused prayer for Israel's spiritual awakening, salvation, and their role in God's Kingdom. It calls the Church to pray for the Jewish people to recognize Yeshua as the Messiah and for Israel's place in God's unfolding plan to be realised.

International Prayer Connect, in collaboration with other prayer movements, is focusing on 110 cities around the world that have disciple-making teams reaching out to many unreached people groups and different communities with the Gospel. The vision is to see the 110 most unreached cities in the world reached with the Gospel, praying for the fulfilment of the Great Commission. This guide highlights 6 of the key cities with links to more information on how to continue praying for those cities throughout the year.

As believers seeking to obey Jesus' command, prayer for Israel and the Jewish people is an expression of God's continued love, faithfulness, and desire to bring them to a full knowledge of Himself.

Our prayer is that this guide inspires you in your intercessions for Israel, so that God's promises for His people are fulfilled! Shalom


"He made peace between Jews and Gentiles by creating in Himself one new man from the two groups." — Ephesians 2:15 (NLT)

In Isaiah 62:1-2, God speaks of His unceasing commitment to Jerusalem, saying, "For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch." The fulfillment of this promise has not yet fully come, and the Lord continues to call watchmen to stand in prayer, day and night, for Jerusalem's spiritual restoration. Isaiah 62:6-7 declares, "On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have appointed watchmen; all day and all night they will never keep silent... give Him no rest until He establishes and makes Jerusalem a praise in the earth."

We pray for the release of a global 'gift of tears,' that the Church would deeply feel God's heart for Israel and His people. Just as Jesus wept over Jerusalem, may we intercede with compassion and urgency for the city's salvation (Luke 19:41).

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Thank God for the remnant of Jewish believers in Jesus: the Messianic Jewish community.
 Pray for spiritual strength, boldness, and unity within Messianic congregations around the world.
- Ask for protection against persecution and for healing of historical divisions between Jewish believers and the wider Church.
- Intercede for their effectiveness in mission, locally and globally: as witnesses of the Gospel in both Jewish & Gentile Contexts.
- Raising Watchmen for Jerusalem: Pray for intercessors to rise, who will stand in the gap for Jerusalem's righteousness and spiritual restoration.
- Restoration of Love Between Jewish and Arab Believers: Pray for healing and unity between Jewish and Arab believers in Israel.
- Jerusalem's Righteousness and Glory: Pray for Jerusalem to be restored to righteousness, shining with glory as a praise on the earth.
- The Global Church as Watchmen: Pray for the global Church to unite in standing as faithful watchmen, interceding for Israel's salvation.



- How can I actively engage in strategic intercession for Jerusalem, aligning my prayers with God's prophetic purposes?
- Why is the existence of Messianic Jews significant for the Church's understanding of God's redemptive plan?
- How can I (or my church) honour and partner with Messianic Jewish believers in mission and prayer?

THE FATHER'S HEART FOR THE LOST

Calling the Jewish people home to their Heavenly Father's unwavering love.

"But Zion said, 'The Lord has forsaken me; the Lord has forgotten me.' 'Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are ever before me.'"—Isaiah 49:14–16

God's love for Israel is unwavering. Though Zion feels forsaken, the Lord responds with the tender image of a nursing mother—yet even more faithful than that. He is a covenant-keeping God. Deuteronomy 32:10–11 describes His care, saying Israel is "the apple of His eye," the very center of His gaze. Zechariah 2:8 reaffirms this, declaring, "Whoever touches you touches the apple of His eye."

Testimony:

A pastor discovered that the church building his congregation now used had once been a site for anti-Jewish rallies during the Nazi era. Deeply convicted, he led the church in a special service of repentance—not only for historical sins but also for the Church's ongoing silence and indifference toward the Jewish people. He invited Jewish believers from a local Messianic congregation to join the gathering. In a profound moment of reconciliation, Jewish elders stepped forward and offered words of forgiveness:


"What you have confessed, the Lord has already forgiven. Let us walk together from this day forward."

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Eyes to See the Pierced One: Pray that Israel would see Yeshua, the Lamb who was slain, and recognize Him as the One "whom they have pierced" (Zechariah 12:10).
- The Father's Heart in the Church: Ask God to reveal His deep love for the Jewish people, stirring compassion and urgency for their salvation (2 Peter 3:9).
- Conviction and Repentance: Pray for the Church to be convicted of any lingering hatred, suspicion, resentment, or indifference. Ask for healing for Messianic Jews and Jewish believers who have experienced rejection from their Christian brothers and sisters.
- Outpouring of Mercy: Intercede for a great outpouring of God's mercy upon Israel, leading to repentance and recognition of Jesus as the promised Messiah (Zechariah 13:1).

SCRIPTURE FOCUS

Isaiah 49:14–16 Deuteronomy 32:10–11 Zechariah 2:7–8



- How can I cultivate a heart that reflects the Father's love and concern for Israel?
- In what ways can I foster mercy, healing, and mutual understanding between the Church and the Jewish community?

PRAY FOR MORE LABOURERS

Asking God to raise and send Gospel messengers to Jewish people worldwide.

"Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field.'"—Matthew 9:35–38

Jesus, moved with compassion, recognized the need for workers to bring the good news to the lost. Today, this call remains urgent—especially for the Jewish people. We praise God for the growing number of Jews who have come to faith in Yeshua as Messiah and Savior. Still, many are waiting to hear the truth that will set them free.

Jesus invites the weary and burdened to come to Him and receive rest for their souls (Matthew 11:28–29). May many hear His voice and respond with open hearts.

PRAYER FOCUS:

- The Sending of Labourers: Ask the Lord of the harvest to raise up and send out labourers—like Paul—who are called to proclaim the Gospel both to the Gentiles and to the Jewish people worldwide (Romans 11:13–14).
- **Bold and Wise Witnesses:** Pray for witnesses who are Spirit-led, full of compassion, and sensitive to Jewish hearts. May they carry the Gospel with humility and power. "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"
- The Spirit of Sonship: Intercede for a fresh outpouring of the Spirit of adoption in Israel, so that many cry out from the depths of their hearts, "Abba, Father."
- **Divine Appointments:** Pray for strategic and Spirit-orchestrated encounters that lead entire Jewish households to turn to Jesus as their Messiah and Lord.

SCRIPTURE FOCUS

Matthew 9:35-38 Matthew 11:28-29



- "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes—to the Jew first and also to the Greek." — Romans 1:16.
- Lord, how can I intentionally and sensitively be a faithful witness of Your love and truth to the Jewish people You've placed in my life?
- What attitudes, words, or actions will reflect Yeshua in a way that honors their heritage and reveals Your heart?

Celebrating God's Holy Spirit poured out - empowering His Church.

Pentecost, Shavuot, Feast of "Weeks" Today

Shavuot (Feast of Weeks) is celebrated by Jewish people as a time of first fruits and the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. Fifty days after Passover, it also marks the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2. Devout Jews from many nations were gathered in Jerusalem when the Spirit came—fulfilling Joel's prophecy and launching the Church with power.

Believers celebrate Pentecost as a reminder of God's faithfulness and empowerment to live boldly. In Jewish tradition, the Book of Ruth is read during Shavuot. Ruth, a Gentile, demonstrated covenant love toward Naomi and embraced the God of Israel. Her story foreshadows God's redemptive plan that includes both Jew and Gentile in one new man (Eph. 2:15).

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Love and Loyalty Ruth 1:16-17: Lord, increase our love for the Jewish people. Teach us to walk in loyalty and compassion like Ruth.
- Revelation of Jesus as Redeemer Ruth 2:12: Jesus, reveal Yourself to Jewish hearts
 as their Kinsman Redeemer. Let Your love shine through us. Just as Joseph was revealed to
 his brothers as a Hebrew, their brother, may Jesus be revealed to the Jewish people as their
 Messiah and elder brother. Genesis 45
- **Presence and Revival Fire Acts 2:3**: Holy Spirit, fill and purify Your people. Set us ablaze to provoke Israel to jealousy for You, the Holy One.

SCRIPTURE FOCUS

Acts 2:1–4 Joel 2:28–32 Ruth 1:16–17 Romans 11:11



- How can I tangibly demonstrate God's covenantal love to the Jewish people this week?
- In what ways is my life bearing witness to Yeshua, drawing both Jews and Gentiles toward His redemptive grace?



The Lord declares in Ezekiel 36 that He will regather Israel from the nations—not for their sake, but for His holy name's sake. Though His name was profaned among the nations, God promises to sanctify it by restoring His people to their land. This return, called Aliyah, reveals God's covenant faithfulness and brings glory to His name before the nations.

While over 8 million Jews live in Israel today, the majority still reside in the diaspora. Yet God's Word assures us: "I will take you from among the nations... and bring you into your own land" (Ezek. 36:24). As believers—grafted into Israel through Yeshua (Romans 11:24)—we have the privilege of partnering in prayer for Aliyah, just as Ezekiel 36:37 invites.

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Draw them in Mercy Isaiah 54:7: Father, by Your grace, draw Your people back to their land with compassion and purpose. May they encounter You, have a conviction of Your mercy, and be assured of Your faithfulness as You fulfill Your word.
- Restore and Rejoice Isaiah 62:4-5: Lord, marry the land to Your people. Let Jerusalem no longer be called "Desolate" but "Married" and "Delight."
- Homecoming for the Redeemed Isaiah 35:10: Bring back Israelis from the nations to the land of Israel to encounter You in Your faithfulness. Open the door for believers in Yeshua to live in the land and be faithful witnesses. Let joy and gladness crown their return.
- Pray for God to regather Jews in the nations back to the land of Israel: "Behold, I will gather them from all the countries to which I drove them in my anger and my wrath and in great indignation. I will bring them back to this place, and I will make them dwell in safety. And they shall be my people, and I will be their God. I will give them one heart and one way, that they may fear me forever, for their own good and the good of their children after them. I will make with them an everlasting covenant, that I will not turn away from doing good to them. And I will put the fear of me in their hearts, that they may not turn from me. I will rejoice in doing them good, and I will plant them in this land in faithfulness, with all my heart and all my soul" (Jeremiah 32:37-41).

SCRIPTURE FOCUS

Romans 11:24 Isaiah 54:7 Isaiah 62:4-5 Isaiah 35:10



- In what ways can I partner with God in prayer and action concerning the prophetic return (Aliyah) of the Jewish people?
- Am I interceding for this movement as part of His covenantal plan asking Him to fulfill His promises for the sake of His name among the nations?



Jewish history in India dates back to ancient times, possibly even to the days of Solomon's temple (1 Kings 10), with later references to the arrival of Jews during the time of St. Thomas in 52 A.D. Over centuries, Jewish communities such as the Bene Israel in Mumbai and Gujarat, Cochin Jews in Kerala, Baghdadi Jews in Mumbai and Pune, and Bnei Menashe in Manipur and Mizoram thrived. However, following the establishment of Israel in 1948, many made Aliyah (returned to Israel), leaving only a small community behind. Today, thousands of young Israelis visit India each year, seeking peace ('Shanti') in places like Varanasi, Dharamshala, and Goa.

During these 10 days we continue with a global prayer strategy which focuses on 110 Key Cities around the world. Please click on the links to these cities to pray for many people to follow Jesus: Mumbai | Varanasi

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Intercession for Salvation: Pray that the Indian Body of Christ would stand in the gap, interceding for the salvation of these Jewish travelers (Romans 10:1).
- Safety and Security: Pray for the protection of young Israelis as they travel, and for God to reveal Himself to them as their protector(Isaiah 52:12b). May Israelis who are whole-heartedly seeking the truth find Him. Jeremiah 29:13
- Friendship Between India and Israel: Pray for a deep, genuine friendship between India and Israel on the global stage, and that the eyes of the lost would be enlightened with the truth and blessing as You have promised (Genesis 12:3).

- How can I offer hospitality to Jewish neighbours or travellers with Christ's love?
- What can I learn from India's church about their mission among Jewish travellers?



Paul's prayer for Israel is a heart cry for the nation's salvation: 'Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved.' (Romans 10:1). The mystery revealed in Romans 11 shows that the hardening of Israel is partial and temporary, with a promise that when the fullness of the Gentiles comes in, all Israel will be saved. As it is written, 'The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will banish ungodliness from Jacob.' (Romans 11:26-27).

From the time of Babel in Genesis 11 Jews have been scattered across the nations. Pray for followers of Jesus to have hearts open and be ready to befriend Jewish people and their communities that the Jews living in these nations would have their eyes opened to know Jesus as Messiah.

In 722 BC the Israelites of the northern kingdom were exiled to Assyria and Assyrians were brought to Israel, where they mixed racially with the Jews to become the Samaritans. God has always been determined to see Israel become faithful not only to Him but also to His mission purpose. After the Jews returned to Israel from captivity, God's missionary purpose was carried out through the Diaspora (dispersion). During this time, a faithful remnant of the Jews spread God's name amongst the nations.

Today the highest populations of Jews are found in these cities, New York, Paris, Vancouver, London, Moscow and Buenos Aires. During the year we pray intentionally for 110 key cities where we see Kingdom movements of disciples multiplying.

Testimony:

In Tehran, an Israeli believer prayed in Hebrew for Iran, and an Iranian leader responded by praying in Farsi for Israel. Later, during a Nowruz celebration, 250 Iranians and Afghanis heard the Gospel—35 requested Bibles. This is a picture of healing and unity in the family of God.

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Faith to Grow: Pray that seeds of faith flourish among Jewish believers worldwide.
- Fulfillment of Promise: Ask God to fulfill His Word and bring salvation to Israel.
- Holy Jealousy: That Gentile believers stir Jewish hearts to seek their Messiah.
- · Body of Christ to befriend Jewish neighbours with humility and love, that they might encounter Yeshua/Jesus as Messiah.
- Pray that thousands of God fearers around the world will congregate with the Jews to acknowledge Jehovah as the Lord of the universe, paving way for the coming of the Messiah.

Romans 11:25-27



- How can I reflect Jesus in a way that stirs Israel's longing for her Deliverer?
- Am I embracing God's redemptive purpose for the Jewish people as central to His global mission?
- How can I intentionally cultivate a missional burden for their restoration through informed intercession and Spirit-led engagement?



In Isaiah 44:1-5, God promises to pour His Spirit on Israel, especially on the next generation. This spiritual outpouring will lead to transformation and renewal, bringing a new sense of identity, where many will boldly declare, "I am the Lord's." As we pray, we ask God to awaken the hearts of Israel's youth to know Him intimately and personally, to satisfy the spiritual thirst of the land.

Joel 2 He sends you abundant showers, both autumn and spring rains, as before. The threshing floors will be filled with grain; the vats will overflow with new wine and oil. Then you will know that I am in Israel, that I am the Lord your God, and that there is no other; never again will my people be shamed. "And afterwards, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions. And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved; for on Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there will be deliverance"

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Pray for the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit: Pray for a mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit
 upon Israel, particularly the younger generation. Ask God to pour water on thirsty ground and
 revive dry places.
- **Pray for identity transformation:** Pray for many in Israel to declare, "I am the Lord's," and embrace their identity in God's covenant.
- Pray for revival among youth: Intercede for spiritual revival to sweep through Israeli youth, that they may grow spiritually, flourish like willows by streams, and live with a deep sense of belonging to God.



- How can I pray for the next generation in Israel to experience the Holy Spirit's renewal?
- What steps can I take to support the awakening of youth in Israel and their transformation into bold witnesses for God's kingdom?



"He makes wars cease to the ends of the earth. He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; He burns the shields with fire." — Psalm 46:9

"Pray for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."—1 Timothy 2:2

Peace is not merely the absence of conflict, but the presence of justice, truth, and restored relationships. In 1963, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. wisely said, "True peace is not merely the absence of tension; it is the presence of justice." Reconciliation is not passive—it is an active and often costly pursuit of healing. It requires confronting injustice, acknowledging pain, and honoring the image of God in every person.

In times of war and division, Jesus calls His followers to be peacemakers (Matthew 5:9), walking in humility and love. The ongoing conflict in the Middle East has highlighted a growing movement of reconciliation between Arab and Jewish believers and Messianic Jews. This unity is a living testimony of the prayer Jesus prayed in John 17: that His followers would be one, just as He and the Father are one.

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Love and Unity Among Believers: Pray for deep love and unity between Jewish, Arab, and Gentile believers. May the prayer of Jesus in John 17 be fulfilled in our day, breaking down walls of division, prejudice, and mistrust.
- Fulfillment of Jesus' Prayer (John 17): Intercede for visible oneness in the Body of Christ—across ethnicities, denominations, and generations—as a witness to the world of God's redeeming love.
- **Humility and Honor:** Pray for humility and mutual respect between Jewish and Arab believers. Ask the Lord to release a spirit of understanding and honor, empowering them to embrace one another as one new man in Messiah.

- Am I a peacemaker in my own relationships and community?
- How can I actively participate in God's work of reconciliation between people groups?

PEACE OF JERUSALEM Asking God for a fresh Pentecost in Jerusalem and beyond. SCRIPTURE FOCUS Psalm 122:6-7 Luke 15:10

"Pray for the peace of **Jerusalem!** 'May they be secure who love you! Peace be within your walls and security within your towers.'" — Psalm 122:6–7

The Jewish people can be likened to the "elder son" in Jesus' parable about the Father's love (Luke 15). Though faithful in many ways, the older brother struggled to rejoice when the younger son returned. Yet the Father's response is full of mercy: "My son, you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate... your brother was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found." (vv. 31–32)

In this story, we glimpse the Father's deep desire—not only to welcome the lost, but to reconcile the faithful as well. God longs to reveal His love to the Jewish people, drawing them into the fullness of their inheritance in Yeshua, the Messiah.

We also acknowledge the vast spiritual need: 8.8 million people in Israel remain unreached by a Gospel witness—60% of them Jewish and 37% Muslim. Yet God's love extends to each one, and His promises remain.

PRAYER FOCUS:

- Spiritual Eyes and Ears Opened: Pray for the Jewish people to receive revelation of Yeshua as Messiah. "You will indeed hear but never understand... But blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear." Isaiah 6:9–10, Matthew 13:16–17
- Outpouring of the Holy Spirit: Ask for a fresh Pentecost in Jerusalem and beyond. Just as the Spirit fell on Jewish believers in Acts 2, pray for another mighty move that brings awakening, repentance, and joy-filled faith in Jesus.
- Fulfillment of God's Covenants: Declare God's faithfulness to His word and His people. Pray for the revelation of His unfailing love across Israel. Ask for open heavens, open homes, and open hearts.
- **Miraculous Confirmation:** Intercede for signs and wonders that confirm the truth of the Gospel and draw many to salvation.
