
From October 12th to



WHO ARE THE HINDU PEOPLE?

As we begin our 15-day prayer journey, it's important to pause and understand the people for whom we are praying. With more than 1.2 billion Hindus worldwide—nearly 15% of the global population—Hinduism is one of the oldest and most widespread religions on earth. The vast majority, over 94%, live in India and Nepal, though vibrant Hindu communities can be found across Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Bali (Indonesia), Mauritius, Trinidad, Fiji, the UK, and North America.

But behind the rituals, symbols, and festivals are real people—mothers, fathers, students, farmers, neighbors—each uniquely created in the image of God, and deeply loved by Him.

What Is the Origin of Hinduism?

Hinduism did not begin with a single founder or sacred event. Rather, it gradually emerged over thousands of years, shaped by ancient writings, oral traditions, and layers of philosophy and mythology. Many scholars trace its roots to the Indus Valley Civilization and the arrival of Indo-Aryan people around 1500 B.C. The Vedas, some of Hinduism's earliest scriptures, were composed during this time and remain central to Hindu belief.

What Does It Mean to Be Hindu?

To be Hindu is not always about believing a specific doctrine—it's often about being born into a culture, a rhythm of worship, and a shared way of life. For many, Hinduism is passed down generationally through festivals, family rituals, pilgrimage, and stories. While some Hindus are deeply devout, others participate more out of cultural identity than spiritual conviction. Hindus may worship one god, many gods, or even consider all of reality as divine.

Hinduism includes countless sects and practices, yet at its core are beliefs in *karma* (cause and effect), *dharma* (righteous duty), *samsara* (the cycle of rebirth), and *moksha* (liberation from the cycle).



WHY WE PRAY DURING DIWALI

A Light That Breaks Through the Darkness

On October 20th, as Diwali celebrations begin across India and around the world, so does our united journey of prayer. Diwali—known as the "Festival of Lights"—is one of Hinduism's most significant holidays, symbolizing the triumph of light over darkness and good over evil. Homes and temples glow with oil lamps, fireworks fill the skies, and families gather to honor gods and goddesses like Lakshmi and Rama. Yet, for millions, these beautiful lights remain only symbolic, unable to bring the true peace, healing, and salvation found in the true Light of the World—Jesus Christ.

That is why we pray. As Hindu families search for blessing, prosperity, and deliverance, believers come together during this sacred window of time to intercede for Hindus to encounter the Jehovah God who *truly* sees, heals, and saves. From October 12th through the next 15 days, believers around the globe will join hearts in prayer—believing that in the very season Hindus seek divine favor, the true and living God will draw near. Let us shine His love boldly and compassionately, trusting that the prayers of the righteous will pierce the darkness and bring eternal light.



WHY WE FOCUSING ON THE 110 CITIES AROUND THE WORLD

Scattered through this guide are a number of highlighted cities which are a sample of the 19 cities in South Asia with Hindu majority populations. If you click on those links it will take you to the profiles for the city on https://110cities.com/ site.

The 110 cities strategic focus has been born from a recognition of a significant global shift towards urbanization and God's heart for cities. The Bible has frequent mention of cities and Jesus weeping over Jerusalem. More than half of the world's population *currently* resides in urban areas, a figure projected to reach two-thirds by 2050, with approximately 3 million people moving to cities weekly through migration.

Central to this prayer and missions initiative is **Psalm 110:1-3**, which provides "marching orders" for the people of God to "volunteer freely" and join in asking God to save the nations. This invitation to labour with Jesus through prayer is rooted in His worthiness.

The selection of the **110 cities** is highly strategic, driven by several factors:

 They are identified as the most unreached megacities globally, these cities contain languages spoken by 97% of the world's remaining unreached peoples.

- The cities were chosen through consultations with church planting movement leaders, prioritizing locations strategic for both reaching resident populations and serving as springboards for movements to spread.
- These cities are the largest church planting movements worldwide for training, resourcing, and sending workers.
- The selection of people groups within these cities was based on language databases and the World Christian Database's list of 257 people groups with the most unevangelized individuals, which together encompass more than 80% of all unevangelized individuals globally.

The aim is to foster a city-wide gospel Kingdom movement, an organic phenomenon where the Holy Spirit moves across the entire city, leading to the body of Christ growing faster than the population and impacting the whole city for Christ. Thank you for joining millions of others in prayer and disciple making amongst those living in these global cities.

DAY 1 · OCTOBER 12 THE OPPRESSED AND FORGOTTEN OF INDIA

Oppression in India, as well as in Indian communities in other nations and key cities such as London, Mombasa, Nairobi, New York, Dallas, Kuala Lumpur, and Dubai, takes many forms — social, religious, economic, and gender-based. It strips people of dignity, denies them opportunities, and keeps them trapped in cycles of poverty, illiteracy, discrimination, and fear. The emotional and psychological toll is heavy, leaving many feeling forgotten and voiceless. It affects not just their present lives but also their future prospects and spiritual openness, as injustice hardens hearts or makes people desperate for hope.

The victims of oppression in India include Dalits who suffer caste-based discrimination, women and girls facing gender-based violence, migrant and daily wage laborers enduring exploitation, religious minorities targeted for their faith, and children trapped in poverty.

These groups cry out, seen by few—yet known by the One who sees all.

Among them are those who journey far from home, whose daily survival tells a story of pain and perseverance. God sees them too...

HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray that God will defend the rights of the poor, Dalits, women, and vulnerable communities, and raise up fair leaders and just systems to protect them.

"He upholds the cause of the oppressed and gives food to the hungry. The Lord sets prisoners free." PSALM 146:7

Pray that believers, churches, and Christian ministries in India would courageously stand with the oppressed, showing them Christ's love in both word and action.

"Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow."

DAY 2 · OCTOBER 13

OVERPOPULATION:GOD'S HEART IN THE CROWD

Hinduism is the third-largest religion in the world, with a significant number of followers primarily in South Asia.

India is one of the most densely populated countries in the world, with a population exceeding 1.4 billion people. In the vast crowds of cities like Delhi and Mumbai, millions move like waves—commuters, families, street vendors, students, beggars. Though cities throb with activity and ambition, they also groan under the weight of need. Overpopulation has placed immense pressure on India's resources, infrastructure, and environment. Traffic congestion, water shortages, and inadequate healthcare and education systems are only surface-level signs of deeper challenges.

In this sea of faces, it's easy to feel forgotten. Yet God sees each one. No life is lost in the crowd to Him. Every man, woman, and child bears divine worth—regardless of caste, status, or religion. His eyes search the land not for numbers, but for names. His heart beats for the lonely in the multitude.

Among the masses are those who migrate from distant villages, seeking daily survival.

Their journey is next...



Pray that God will grant wisdom and discernment to India's leaders and policymakers to manage the nation's resources responsibly. May every citizen live with dignity, justice, and security.

"If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault..." IAMES 1:5

Pray that the Gospel will shine in India's crowded cities and remote villages where multitudes still wait to hear of Jesus. Ask the Lord to send laborers who will carry His hope with courage, especially among the Marathi and Hindi Rajput communities, that they may encounter the love and truth of Christ.

DAY 3 · OCTOBER 14

MIGRANT WORKERS: JOURNEYS OF HARDSHIP, SURVIVAL, AND HOPE

Migrant workers in India live lives marked by hardship, struggle, and resilience. Leaving behind their families, homes, and villages in search of daily wages, they travel to crowded cities and unfamiliar towns like Kolkata—often facing exploitation, poor living conditions, and social neglect. Recent human rights research suggests that 600 million Indians—nearly half the population—are internal migrants, with 60 million crossing state borders. They often hope for a better future for their children, the hope of returning home with dignity, and the hope that someone will see their worth.

HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray that the Lord will comfort the hearts of families left behind in villages, especially children, spouses, and the elderly. May they be filled with hope and not despair. May Jesus heal broken hearts and sustain these families with love, provision, and community support.

"God sets the lonely in families, he leads out the prisoners with singing." PSALM 68:6 May God raise up voices of justice on behalf of migrant workers. May they find dignity in their labor and be treated with fairness and respect. May doors open for education, skills training, and opportunities that uplift their futures and break cycles of poverty.

"Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute." PROVERBS 31:8

But not all pain comes from movement — some is buried deep within. In hearts clouded by shame, fear, and silence, God still sees...







PRAY?

Pray that those burdened by fear and shame will find rest in Him. May God send his laborers who will carry this hope to those aching in the shadows, reminding them they are known, valued, and deeply loved by the One who calls them by name.

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine." ISAIAH 43:1

Intercede for Hindus trapped by fear of curses, spirits, family rejection, or future uncertainty. Pray that they would experience freedom from chains of fear and find courage and calm in Christ.

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you... Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." JOHN 14:27

Pray that those facing shame — from personal failures, family expectations, or religious guilt — would encounter the love of God that restores dignity and self-worth.

"Instead of your shame you will receive a double portion... you will rejoice in your inheritance."

ISAIAH 61:7



DAY 5 · OCTOBER 16 SOCIETAL GROUPS OF INDIA

India is a land of contrasts — where alongside vibrant festivals and rich traditions, millions silently struggle in the shadows. Children grow up on railway platforms and crowded slums, longing for a safe place to learn and play. Women and girls battle against discrimination and violence. Men silently carry the weight of broken dreams and expectations, while widows and the elderly often live unseen and unheard. Migrant workers leave behind their homes and loved ones in search of daily wages, and countless families bear hidden scars from poverty and loss.

This is the India God sees—not only in pain, but in potential. Each soul formed in His image. As we end this time of intercession for the hidden and hurting, we turn our attention to a place where many of these stories converge—a city pulsing with politics, poverty, and promise. Let us now intercede for Delhi, the heart of the nation.

HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray that the children, teens, men, women, families, and the elderly — would encounter the love and saving grace of Jesus Christ. Ask God to send laborers to boldly reach out to them with compassion.

"The Lord is not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance." 2 PETER 3:9

May God protect the vulnerable from abuse, violence, and exploitation. May He raise people to stand up for their rights and provide refuge and care.

"Defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed. Rescue the weak and the needy..." PSALM 82:3-4

And from there, we lift our eyes to the nation as a whole—longing not just to be seen, but to be healed. As we begin the next section, let us pray for peace, justice, and truth to flood the land, and for the love of Christ to break through every national stronghold...

CITY IN FOCUS :: DELHI

INTERCEDING FOR THE HEART OF THE NATION

Delhi, India's sprawling capital, pulses with history, power, and contrast. Within its ancient walls and government buildings live both privilege and poverty. Bustling streets carry millions—migrant workers, politicians, daily laborers, and families squeezed into slums. The city is overcrowded, yet many in it feel invisible. Amid its complexity, Delhi reflects the full spectrum of India's beauty and brokenness.

Pray that in the midst of Delhi's crowds, each life would be seen as precious by God's people. Intercede for the Dalits, the vulnerable, and the overlooked—that churches and ministries would rise to meet needs with love and courage.

Pray for the higher caste, Brahmin and professionals to have a supernatural encounter with Jesus and to have their hearts opened to Jesus being real and not a western God or good guru.

DAY 6 · OCTOBER 17 HEALING IN A LAND OF DIVISION

India is a land of color, complexity, and contradiction. Yet beneath the vibrant festivals and crowded streets lie deep divides—religious tensions, political hostility, caste resentment, and cultural suspicion. These rifts have widened in recent years, often turning neighbor against neighbor and law against liberty. In some states, protests over identity, land, or faith have ended in violence and fear.

But God sees what no media report can fully capture: the wounded soul of a nation. He is not indifferent to hatred, injustice, or oppression. He is the Healer who speaks peace over chaos and calls His people to stand in the gap. While politicians campaign for power, the Church must intercede for mercy.

Let us pray that healing would not just be structural, but spiritual—that hearts would be softened, and walls of hostility would come down through the love of Jesus.

HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray for peace in regions marked by unrest and for just leadership in local and national governments.

Ask God to bring stability rooted in truth and compassion..

"Let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" AMOS 5:24 Ask God to raise up peacemakers pastors, believers, and youth who will reconcile communities torn by suspicion and suspicion, strife and persecution.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." MATTHEW 5:9

As we begin this time of intercession for healing across India, we must look not only at surface divisions—but at the deeper wounds caused by centuries of systemic injustice. Among these, the pain of caste continues to divide communities and souls alike...



DAY 7 · OCTOBER

THE WOUNDS OF CASTE: HEALING FROM INJUSTICE

Though officially banned, caste discrimination continues to shape daily life for millions in India. Dalits—often called "the broken people"—still face routine exclusion from jobs, education, and even wells or temples. Many live in segregated villages. Some children are forced to clean toilets in schools while others are praised for their lineage.

In 2023, over 50,000 cases of caste-based violence were reported.
Behind each number is a story—like a 15-year-old Dalit girl in
Patna, Biliar, assaulted for entering a temple, or a man in Bhopal,
Madbya Pradesh beaten for walking through an upper-caste
neighborhood.

But Jesus dismantled social hierarchies when He touched lepers, welcomed outcasts, and elevated

the unseen. His healing is not only for individuals but for entire systems of injustice.

GOD HEALS

Caste may divide people outwardly, but persecution strikes at the very core of faith. For those who follow Christ—especially Hindu Background Believers—the cost of discipleship can be severe. Let us now lift up those who are wounded simply for choosing Jesus...

PRAY?

Pray for healing and dignity for Dalits and all oppressed by caste. Ask that they would know their identity in Christ as beloved sons and daughters.

"He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." PSALM 147:3

Intercede for churches to reject casteism in practice and to reflect the radical equality of the Gospel.

"There is neither Jew nor Gentile... for you are all one in Christ Jesus." GALATIANS 3:28

DAY 8 · OCTOBER 19

HEALING THE HEART OF THE PERSECUTED

Following Jesus in India and in some other parts of the world, can cost everything. For Hindu Background Believers (HBBs), the path of faith often comes with rejection from family, job loss, and threats of violence. In regions with anti-conversion laws, even attending a prayer meeting can lead to arrest.

In 2022, a group of HBBs in Chhattisgarh had their homes burned by villagers. In Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, a pastor was jailed for "coercing conversions" after simply praying for the sick. These are not isolated incidents—India now ranks among the top 15 most dangerous countries for Christians.

And yet, even deeper than external persecution is the silent suffering carried by women and girls across India. Their trauma often hides in the shadows—where injustice meets silence. But the Lord sees. Let us now pray for His healing to meet the deep wounds carried by His daughters...



HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray for strength and healing for persecuted believers, especially HBBs facing threats or rejection. May God restore their joy and deepen their faith.

"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." PSALM 34:18

Pray for their persecutors to encounter Christ through dreams, acts of mercy, and the boldness of believers.

"Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse." ROMANS 12:14



DAY 9 · OCTOBER 20

TRAUMA IN THE LIVES OF WOMEN AND GIRLS

In many parts of India, being female still means being unseen or undervalued. From the womb to widowhood, many girls and women face barriers simply for existing. Some are denied education. Others are trafficked, assaulted, or silenced by cultural shame. The trauma they carry is often hidden—unspoken, untreated, and unresolved.

According to national data, a woman is raped in India every 16 minutes. Dowry deaths and domestic abuse cases are widespread. In 2022, nearly 20,000 women were reported as victims of human trafficking. Behind every number is a name—a daughter of God who deserves dignity and healing.

Jesus uplifted women wherever He went. He saw the bleeding woman, the Samaritan outcast, and the grieving mother. He still sees.

HOW CAN WE PRΔY?

Pray for Christian ministries and churches to lead in advocacy, rescue, counseling, and discipleship of vulnerable women.

"He will rescue them from oppression and violence, for precious is their blood in his sight."

PSALM 72:14

Pray for healing from trauma—physical, emotional, and spiritual—for women and girls across India. Ask God to protect them from harm and restore their voice and value.

"Instead of your shame you will receive a double portion..."
ISAIAH 61:7

A broken nation cannot heal without lifting up its next generation. India's youth—restless, pressured, and often without direction—need more than opportunity; they need identity and hope. As we intercede for healing, let us now cry out for the hearts and futures of India's young people...

DAY 10 · OCTOBER 21

HEALING THE SOUL OF THE NATION'S YOUTH

India has the largest population of young people in the world. Over 600 million are under the age of 25. Yet with opportunity comes pressure—academic stress, unemployment, social expectations, and spiritual emptiness. Many youth wrestle with depression, addiction, or suicidal thoughts. In 2022, more than 13,000 student suicides were recorded in India—an all-time high.

But Jesus sees this generation not as a problem to fix, but a people to call. His healing reaches beyond performance or pain. He offers identity, hope, and purpose. Revival in India may very well begin with its youth.

Let us intercede that their wounds would not define them—but that they would rise in healing and boldness as messengers of truth.



HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray for mental, emotional, and spiritual healing for India's youth. Ask the Lord to break the spirit of suicide, confusion, and despair.

"You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you." ISAIAH 26:3

Pray that young believers would be empowered to live boldly for Christ and that entire movements would be birthed through them.

"Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example..."

1 TIMOTHY 4:12

This is the generation God is raising up—young men and women whose stories are still being written.

As we end this section of prayer, we lift up not only individuals, but entire cities that shape the nation's future. Let us now turn our hearts to one such city in focus...

CITY IN FOCUS :: ASANSOL

HEALING AMID IDOLS: A CRY FOR THE BENGALIS

Tucked along the banks of the Damodar River, Asansol is one of West Bengal's largest industrial cities. Known for coal mines and steel plants, it's also a spiritual stronghold of **temple worship**, **idol pujas**, **and devotion to gods like Ganesh and Kali**. For many Bengalis, these rituals are cultural expressions—but behind the incense and offerings lies a spiritual bondage that blinds hearts to the truth.

Altars fill the streets during festivals. Songs to many gods echo through

in hopes of blessing. Yet in the midst of it all, **Jesus is still drawing hearts**. Hidden believers are quietly sharing the Gospel. A few churches gather with courage. God sees the worshipers—and longs to turn their hearts from creation

to Creator.

HOW CAN WE PRΔΥ?

Pray for spiritual healing across Asansol. Ask that the strongholds of idol worship, fear, and deception would be broken in Jesus' name. Pray for divine encounters that turn hearts from lifeless rituals to the living God.

"They exchanged the truth about God for a lie, and worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator." ROMANS 1:25

Pray for the boldness and protection of Bengali believers. Ask God to strengthen house churches, evangelists, and new disciples in Asansol. May they be lights in the darkness, filled with wisdom and compassion.

THE GOD WHO SAVES THE HONEST SEEK

FINDING TRUTH BEYOND TRADITION

From a young age, many Hindus are taught to approach life with reverence and devotion. Through daily puja, temple visits, and disciplined prayer, they often express a deep respect for the divine. Yet beneath these rituals, many quietly wonder: "Is this enough? Can the gods hear me?" The path to truth isn't always clear. It may begin with disappointment, confusion, or spiritual silence. But when someone seeks God with a sincere heart—asking to know Hom on His terms—Jesus often meets them in profound ways.

This is Sanjay's story. Raised in a devout Hindu home, he once bargained with the God of the Bible. When the peace he felt disappeared, he searched across India for answers. But only when he prayed honestly did Jesus respond. His search ended not in a temple, but in a relationship with the living God.

TESTIMONY SANJAY'S STORY

As a Hindu, I watched my mother pray faithfully to her gods, and her devotion taught me to believe in God sincerely. One day I visited a church, and I prayed to the God of the Bible, "Give me good luck, and I'll follow the Ten Commandments." I felt peace—but just for a few days. When it faded, I felt abandoned.

Years later, the thought, "Did you look for Me?" stirred something deep in me. I began exploring Hinduism, visiting holy places across India—but the distance remained.

One night, I prayed honestly: "God, I'm willing to know You on Your terms, not mine." A friend later told me about Jesus, but I wasn't interested. Months passed. One night, walking home, I cried out to God for forgiveness and help. As an experiment, I prayed to Jesus, inviting Him to be my God. And He came. And He stayed.

Sanjay found God through quiet persistence and an honest heart—but not all seekers begin their journey far from religion. Some, like Gopal, have spent their lives immersed in spiritual devotion, yet still long for truth. Turn the page to discover how the God who saves meets even those faithfully searching within temple walls.

HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Ask the Lord to raise up believers who will listen patiently, share the truth gently, and walk alongside seekers with grace and courage.

Pray for spiritual hunger and devotion to bring more people like Sanjay to ask God to reveal himself to them through dreams, answered prayers, peace and freedom from disappointments and despair.





DAY 13 · OCTOBER 24 THE GOD WHO SAVES THE DEVOTED

FROM RITUAL TO RELATIONSHIP

Gopal was a respected Hindu priest, trained from a young age to lead others in temple worship. He had memorized chants, performed rituals with precision, and earned the reverence of his community. Yet behind the disciplined devotion, Gopal carried a deep spiritual emptiness—a silence that the gods never seemed to answer.

Searching for truth, he turned to Islam and began reading the Qur'an. There, he encountered *Isa Masiha* (Jesus the Messiah), and something stirred in his heart. Drawn by curiosity and longing, he began reading the Bible and discovered a God who spoke with love, compassion, and truth.

The peace he'd been missing came not through rituals, but through a relationship.

Gopal surrendered his life to Jesus, and everything changed. Today, he is a bold pastor, preaching Christ where he once burned incense to idols. His heart now burns with a different fire—one of love for the lost and joy in the One who saved him.

We pray for many more like Gopal—those deeply devoted, yet longing for the living God.

HOW CAN WE PRAY?

Pray for Hindu priests, gurus, and religious leaders who are searching in silence. Ask that Jesus would send believers into their lives who can lovingly share the truth and walk with them in their spiritual journey.

Pray for Brahmin leaders across society to have a curiosity and search for truth and meaning. Pray for social media and online information, that the Holy Spirit will reveal who Jesus is and many people will be able to become devotees of Jesus.

Turning from tradition takes courage—but finding truth changes everything. Gopal's story reminds us that even those once devoted to false gods can be transformed by the living God. But what happens when a heart full of hostility meets the message of Jesus? On the next page, we meet someone who once rejected Christ with aggression—until an unexpected encounter shattered his resistance.

THE GOD WHO SAVES THE HARD-HEARTED

FROM OPPOSITION TO OBEDIENCE

In many parts of the Hindu world, Jesus is not merely misunderstood—He is actively opposed. For some, allegiance to cultural identity and ancestral religion feels inseparable. The message of Christ is perceived as foreign, threatening deeply rooted beliefs and community bonds. It is not uncommon for Christians to face open hostility, rejection, or even violence when sharing the Gospel.

Yet even among the fiercest opponents of the Gospel, God is at work. His love is not stopped by anger, nor is His truth hindered by hardened hearts. Again and again, we witness how those most resistant to Jesus can become the boldest proclaimers of His name.

This is the testimony of Santosh, a former snake charmer known for his devotion to Hinduism and open hatred for Christianity. He once threatened pastors who entered his village. But one invitation, and one act of courage from his brother, became a turning point. Delivered from demonic oppression, Santosh experienced the love of Jesus—and everything changed. Now he travels village to village, sharing the very message he once tried to silence.

PRAY?

Pray for radical conversions among hostile communities, that former persecutors would become bold witnesses like Santosh.

Pray for miracles, healings and spiritual freedom as Jesus power and reality is seen and experienced by many people in supernatural encounters.
