You will encounter stories from cities such as Medan (Indonesia), Peshawar (Pakistan), Marrakech (Morocco), Niamey (Niger), Dubai (United Arab Emirates), Addis Ababa (Ethiopia), and Sanaa (Yemen).

These accounts are not distant headlines. They are signposts of a growing harvest!

Whether you pray alone, with your family, in your church, or online with others, may this week deepen your understanding, enlarge your compassion, and strengthen your confidence that Jesus is still drawing people to Himself.

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# Understanding Islam

## What Muslims Believe

Islam began in the 7th century in the Arabian Peninsula through the teachings of the Prophet Muhammad. Today it is the world's second-largest religion, with followers across every continent.

At the heart of Islamic belief is **Tawhid** — the absolute oneness and uniqueness of God (Allah). God is understood as singular, sovereign, and incomparable. Associating partners with God (shirk) is considered the gravest sin.

Muslims believe:

- The **Qur'an** is the final and perfect revelation of God.
- Muhammad is the final prophet in a long line including Abraham, Moses, and Jesus.
- Jesus (Isa) was born of the Virgin Mary and performed miracles, but is not the Son of God and was not crucified in the biblical sense.
- Salvation is ultimately determined by God's mercy, but good deeds, obedience, and faithfulness matter deeply.

The **Five Pillars of Islam** shape daily life:

1. Declaration of faith (Shahada)
2. Daily prayers (Salat)
3. Giving to the poor (Zakat)
4. Fasting during Ramadan (Sawm)
5. Pilgrimage to Mecca (Hajj)

For many Muslims, faith is not merely personal — it is woven into family, culture, law, and community identity.


Yet within the global Muslim world there is enormous diversity: cultural, theological, ethnic, and political.

The two largest branches are:

- **Sunni Islam** (majority worldwide)
- **Shia Islam** (significant populations in certain regions)

Countries with large Muslim populations include Indonesia, Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Nigeria, Egypt, Iran & Turkey.

Understanding what Muslims believe helps us pray with insight rather than assumption.



# The Muslim World Today: Spiritual & Cultural Realities

The Muslim world is not monolithic. It spans bustling megacities, desert villages, mountain communities, and diaspora neighbourhoods across Europe and North America.

In many Muslim societies, **family honour and community belonging** are central. Religious identity is deeply intertwined with heritage. For someone to follow Jesus may carry social cost — rejection, pressure, or even danger.

At the same time, remarkable movements are unfolding.

Across parts of the Middle East, North Africa, and South Asia, increasing numbers of Muslims report dreams and visions of Jesus. Many testify to encountering Christ as “Isa al-Masih” — Jesus the Messiah — through Scripture, satellite media, friendships, or personal revelation.

In some regions, house fellowships are multiplying quietly. In others, believers endure persecution yet remain steadfast.

Strategic urban centres — including Istanbul, Karachi, Cairo, Tehran & Jakarta are home to millions who have little access to the Gospel.

## Prayer is vital because:

- Many Muslim-background believers need courage.
- Scripture access remains limited in certain languages.
- Misunderstandings about Jesus persist.
- Political tensions often complicate witness.
- Spiritual hunger is increasing.

We do not pray from fear.

**We pray from love.**

We do not pray against people.

**We pray that hearts would encounter the living Christ.**

As 2 Corinthians 3:16 reminds us:

**“Whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.”**

May our understanding grow deeper.

May our compassion grow wider.

May our prayers grow stronger.

# RAMADAN

## A Sacred Month in the Muslim World

Ramadan is the holiest month in the Islamic calendar. It commemorates the period when Muslims believe the Qur'an was first revealed to the Prophet Muhammad. Because the Islamic calendar is lunar, Ramadan shifts earlier each year in the Gregorian calendar.

For Muslims around the world — whether in villages, megacities, refugee camps, or diaspora communities — Ramadan is a deeply spiritual time marked by fasting, prayer, charity, repentance, and renewed devotion to God.

It is often described as a month of mercy.

## The Significance of Fasting

Fasting during Ramadan (known as *sawm*) is one of the Five Pillars of Islam. From dawn until sunset, practicing Muslims abstain from:

- Food
- Drink
- Smoking
- Marital relations

The fast is not only physical; it is meant to cultivate:

- Self-discipline
- Purity of thought
- Generosity
- Dependence on God
- Compassion for the poor

Many Muslims increase their prayer, give to charity (*zakat*), and seek forgiveness for sins during this month. The final ten days are considered especially sacred, with heightened spiritual intensity.



The month concludes with the celebration of Eid al-Fitr, a joyful festival marked by communal prayers, meals, new clothes, and acts of generosity.

## A TYPICAL DAY DURING RAMADAN

While practice varies across cultures, a typical day often follows this rhythm:

### Pre-Dawn (Suhoor)

Families wake before sunrise to eat a light meal and pray. This quiet hour is often peaceful and reflective.

### Dawn Prayer

The first of five daily prayers marks the official beginning of the fast.

### Daytime

Work and school continue, but energy levels may be lower due to lack of food and water. Many avoid unnecessary distractions and focus on spiritual reflection.

### Afternoon & Evening Prayers

Mosques become increasingly active. Community gatherings strengthen during this month.

### Sunset (Iftar)

At sunset, the fast is broken — traditionally with dates and water. Families and communities gather for shared meals. In many countries, streets fill with celebration and generosity.

### Night Prayers (Tarawih)

Special extended prayers are held in mosques. Portions of the Qur'an are recited nightly throughout the month.

For many Muslims, Ramadan is a time of sincerity — when hearts are softer and spiritual questions more present.

# How to share Jesus during Ramadan

## Introducing Jesus with Love and Wisdom

Ramadan presents a unique opportunity for friendship and meaningful conversation.

First and foremost, Christians are called to respond with respect.

- Acknowledge the commitment fasting requires.
- Ask thoughtful questions about what the month means personally.
- Express genuine interest rather than debate.

Hospitality is central during Ramadan. If invited to an iftar meal, accepting graciously can build trust and deepen friendship.

When spiritual conversations arise, Christians may gently share:

- That Jesus also fasted and prayed (Matthew 4:1–2).
- That Christians, too, seek forgiveness and closeness to God.
- That Jesus is called “the Word of God” and “the Messiah” in both the Bible and the Qur’an.

Rather than presenting Jesus as a rival prophet, speak of Him as the fulfillment of God’s revelation — the One who perfectly reveals the Father’s heart, who embodies mercy, and who offers assurance of forgiveness through grace.

Questions can be powerful:

- “Who do you believe Jesus is?”
- “What do you think it means that He is called Messiah?”
- “How do you experience assurance of forgiveness?”

Above all, remember:

- The goal is not to win an argument.
- The goal is to bear witness to Christ.
- The Holy Spirit alone lifts the veil.

Let love lead. Let humility guide. Let truth be spoken gently.  
“Speak the truth in love.” — Ephesians 4:15





# Until the Veil Is Lifted

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## How to Use This Guide

This prayer guide is an invitation to stand in the gap with compassion, humility, and expectancy — asking God to move powerfully among Muslim peoples and to transform us as we pray. Each day is carefully shaped to help Scripture, story, and intercession come together — until the veil is lifted and Christ is revealed.

Begin each day by sitting with the theme and Scripture passage. Read slowly and prayerfully, inviting the Holy Spirit to illuminate God's heart for the people and city highlighted. Allow the Word to shape your perspective, deepen your love, and align your prayers with God's purposes.

Then read the real-life testimony. These accounts reflect courageous obedience, quiet faithfulness, and the surprising ways Jesus is revealing Himself — through dreams, relationships, Scripture, and small gatherings of believers. As you read, thank God for what He is doing. Where there is opposition, hardship, or spiritual resistance, pray for breakthrough, protection, and perseverance.

Take time to explore further using the QR code. Learn about the featured city, its history, culture, and spiritual landscape. Understanding fosters compassion, and compassion fuels faithful intercession.

Each day also includes focused prayer points and a practical response. Pause and ask how the Lord may be inviting you to act — perhaps by building friendships, learning more about Muslims in your community, sharing your faith with greater courage, or committing to ongoing prayer. As we pray for others, God refines and strengthens our own faith.

You may wish to close each day with worship, lifting your eyes to Jesus — the One who draws all people to Himself.

As you pray, hold fast to this promise: when hearts turn to the Lord, the veil is taken away.

## Jesus revealed to seeking hearts

Amisha led five women in reading stories from the Bible about prophets - a good way to introduce the Word of God to Muslims. Participants then share the stories with their families and friends and obey the lessons God impresses on them during their time together.

Three of the women have had visions of Isa al Masih (Jesus the Messiah). In the dreams, He had instructed one to forgive her husband and encouraged another by confirming that she was studying His Truth. The third had a simple yet profound vision of being embraced by Jesus! Before long, all five women became followers of Isa. Amisha baptized them in the irrigation canal of a nearby rice paddy.

Amisha is a layperson who has been trained in Disciple Making Movements and longs to hear and obey Jesus. All six women are in the process of learning to become reproducing (recruiting) disciple-makers.

These women were the first in their families to come to Christ. Pray for them as they engage their husbands with the Word of God and encourage their spiritual leadership. This process can sometimes be messy, but it is so important in bringing the whole household to faith.

### Prayer Points

- Pray for continued revelation of Jesus through dreams and Scripture.  
*"Behold, the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" John 1:29*
- Pray for spiritual hunger among seeking families.  
*"Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved - you and your households". Acts 16:31*
- Pray for more bold disciple makers to witness and share Christ clearly.  
*"The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field" Luke 10:2*



### Application

Ask Jesus to reveal Himself clearly to someone you know this week.

## Reconciled to God through Christ


The door was opened through Zaim, a newly baptized disciple and vice principal, who was actively sharing the Word of God within his school community. This connection led Wajeeh to the home of the school's Director, a powerful government officer, who was seeking help for her family, which was wracked by conflict.

The officer gathered her troubled family, including a son caught in bad company and a daughter who was facing divorce. Wajeeh didn't focus on their failures; instead, he shared the story of Adam and Eve and continued by explaining how Jesus was sent to restore relationships - first with God through His Sacrifice, and then with one another through forgiveness. Forgiveness heals our relationship with God and with others.

Recognizing the depth of their spiritual and relational need, the high-ranking officer showed remarkable humility. She asked Wajeeh to lay hands on her and her entire family and bless them in Jesus' name. Zaim watched in amazement as the government official bowed her head. The transformation was immediate and real: the daughter who had been contemplating divorce soon went back to her husband. This miracle happened because of Jesus' sacrifice; forgiveness is always possible, and even the most broken families can be restored.

### Prayer Points

- Pray for supernatural humility in families needing restoration.  
*"I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you. Ezekiel 36:26*
- Pray for the power of Jesus' sacrifice to restore broken relationships.  
*"He will restore the hearts of the fathers to their children and the hearts of the children to their fathers". Malachi 4:6*
- Pray for disciple makers to carry forgiveness that heals communities.  
*"The spirit of the Lord is upon me...he has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted". Isaiah 61:1*



### Application

Initiate reconciliation today where pride has prevented healing in a relationship.

## Freedom through Christ's authority

A Muslim business owner in Marrakech had an employee who suffered from fainting spells. They believed the fainting spells were the result of demonic influence on the employee's life. The business owner learned of the good news of Christ and began to follow Jesus.

Months passed, and the employee with the fainting spells eventually left his job. The business owner, who was now a follower of Jesus, met up with his former employee to share about the power of Jesus over death, sickness, and demonic forces.

He told him that he could pray for him to be delivered and healed. The employee accepted this prayer. He also believed in Jesus, was delivered from the demonic spells, and said, "If you'd known this truth for a while, why didn't you tell me this sooner? I was really suffering."

This young man, who experienced Jesus' power, is now sharing the Good News with his family. Pray that they also will come to faith.

### Prayer Points

- Pray for continued deliverance and freedom from oppression. *"For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the work of the devil" 1 John 3:8*
- Pray for new believers to boldly share Jesus' power. *"Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous deeds among all peoples". Psalm 96:3*
- Pray for entire families to come to faith through testimony. *"You and your households shall be saved". Acts 16:31*



### Application

Pray boldly against spiritual oppression and share Christ's authority with confidence.

## Christlike service transforms communities

The biblical call to humble service, echoing Christ's sacrifice in Philippians 2:7-8, is beautifully alive in Niger. Two missionary families, who stepped away from good government jobs in their home country, chose to serve in this 99% Muslim nation as church planters five years ago. When a coup caused their financial support to drop to nothing, the organization asked them to return home.

Yet, feeling God's call, they found their way back to their village with no resources. They embraced the local lifestyle fully, working in gardens and on farms just like the locals. You couldn't tell them apart from the community. This humble example was revolutionary; traditionally, Muslim women in the community stayed home, but seeing the missionary wives working in the fields inspired other women to join them.

They started DBS (Discovery Bible Study) groups, teaching women about healthy diets, how to support their families, and how to share and work the land together. This work brought dignity and joy. The men eventually joined the farm work too. Despite floods sometimes sweeping away everything, the couples remain obedient and courageous and continue sharing the gospel. They are making disciples, baptizing people, and seeing Christ manifest in the community because they truly made themselves of "no reputation".

This movement is bearing fruit in the desert in northern Niger among the Tuareg and Fulani people. New disciples are being trained in the capital. When these disciples return to their villages, their families also come to follow Jesus. Furthermore, new disciple-making communities are growing in faith and prayer and are seeing people being healed with signs and wonders.

### Prayer Points

- Pray for divine protection and covering over families.  
*"I will be a wall of fire around her, and I will be the glory with her". Zechariah 2:5*
- Pray for provision, support and blessing over the work of their hands.  
*"The Lord will command the blessing on your barns and on all you set your hand". Deuteronomy 28:8*
- Pray for long-term restoration in families and communities.  
*"For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future". Jeremiah 29:11*

## Courage to witness faithfully

Imen is a Sudanese woman living in Dubai to make money to send to her family. While there, she came to Christ through reading Creation to Christ stories from the Bible. She immediately began sharing and leading other Sudanese, North Africans and Arab Muslims to Christ.

Early in her journey, she shared with her friend Samar. Initially, Samar liked what she was hearing, but her interest quickly faded. One day, around noon, Imen was doing a Discovery Bible Study of the Crucifixion story in Luke Chapter 23. When she got to verse 44, "By this time it was about noon, and darkness fell across the whole land..." she received a text from Samar saying that her sister had died. Samar had just moved back to the UAE to pay for her sister's dialysis treatments in Sudan. Tragically, the power went out while her sister was having dialysis, and that power outage killed her.

Imen, deeply moved by the devastating news, said, "God holds time in his hands. No one knows the time, the hour, or when the darkness will fall. We have to get right with Him."

### Prayer Points

- Pray for Samar and her family and many who are bereaved to encounter God's comfort and saving Grace in their grief.  
*"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit" Psalm 34:18*
- Pray for Imen and many like her to be strengthened as witnesses, boldly proclaiming that God holds time and eternity in His hands.  
*"My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who persecute me". Psalms 31:15*
- Pray for many Sudanese, North Africans and Arab Muslims to turn to Christ through such divine moments and stories.  
*"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light". Isaiah 9:2*

## Faith releases resurrection power

Jesus tells his disciples in Matthew 17:20, "Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."

Today's story comes from Ethiopia, where God moved powerfully among an unreached people group. While disciple-makers were serving on the ground in Ethiopia, a community of believers in Uganda committed to pray specifically for breakthrough in Ethiopia. Though separated by borders, they were united in faith.


As the Ugandan believers interceded for Ethiopia, the disciple-makers became the hands and feet of Jesus. They witnessed growing openness, provision, divine favour and remarkable answers to prayer.

In one Ethiopian village, a believer named Araara was attacked by a gang of men who broke his legs and fingers and left him for dead, hiding his body under leaves. As prayer continued to rise from Uganda for Ethiopia, Araara encountered Jesus in heaven. He was told he would return to share the Good News of the Kingdom.

Miraculously, Araara was restored to life. He stood up, shook off the leaves and walked back to the house of prayer in Ethiopia. When the gang members and many others saw him alive, they were overwhelmed — and many turned to believe in Jesus.

### Prayer Points

- Pray for greater unity and spiritual authority between praying communities and disciple makers.  
*"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity...for there the Lord commands His blessings. Psalm 133:1;3"*
- Pray for the continued release of resurrection power, bold faith, and miraculous signs among the unreached.  
*"You will see the Glory of God". John 11:40*
- Pray for Araara's testimony to spark widespread repentance and a harvest of many souls.  
*"Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the Lord". Psalm 40:3*



### Application

Exercise mustard-seed faith in one situation you have considered impossible.

## Eternal hope beyond suffering

The ongoing war continues to affect the people of Sanaa, Yemen. Violence, insecurity, and displacement mean children go hungry, men are unable to provide for their families, and women struggle to hold the pieces together. Shame over Ahmed's inability to provide for his family threatened his identity and prompted questions about his worth.

When Ahmed's friend at the cafe told him he had started hearing stories from God's Word that were bringing him hope, Ahmed was intrigued. The Creation to Christ stories he heard captured the hearts of Ahmed and his family.

In the midst of such hopelessness, lives are being touched by the Gospel. Bold witnesses of the death and resurrection of Christ are taking these stories from the Bible to homes filled with fear, brokenness, and unmet expectations. The hope of the final story in Revelation 7 is rewriting identity and purpose in this war-torn land.

"...and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat..."

### Prayer Points

- Pray for God's presence to shelter families in Yemen, and break any cycles of fear, hunger or despair.  
*"He who sits on the throne will shelter them with His presence...they shall hunger no more". Revelations 7: 15-16*
- Pray for men like Ahmed to discover their true identity and worth in Christ and not in circumstances.  
*"I will give them a new heart and put a new spirit within them". Ezekiel 36:26*
- Pray for bold witnesses to bring hope of Jesus into homes that are ravaged with war, violence and insecurity, igniting faith and transformation  
*"May the God of all hope fill you with all Joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the holy spirit". Romans 15:13*



### Application

Anchor your identity in Christ's hope, not circumstances or worldly security.
