WHY ARE WE PRAYING FOR THE MUSLIM PEOPLES?

You might be wondering, “Why are we praying for Muslim people during this prayer journey?”

That’s a great question — and the answer really matters!

There are nearly 2 billion Muslim people in the world today. Many live across North Africa, the Middle East, and large parts of Asia, and many more live in cities all around the world — maybe even near where you live. Behind the mosques, markets, festivals, and daily prayers are real people — mums and dads, grandparents, teenagers, and millions of children just like you. And God loves every single one of them.

The Bible tells us that God made all people in His image (Genesis 1:27). That means every Muslim child is precious and deeply loved by Him. But many Muslim families have never heard the good news about Jesus — that He loves them, forgives them, and wants to be their forever friend.

Muslims believe in one God and respect many Bible prophets, including Jesus. But most do not yet know who Jesus truly is — the Son of God who came to save the world. Jesus said, “I am

the way and the truth and the life” (John 14:6). Through Him, we can know God personally and receive peace that lasts forever.

That’s why we pray! We ask God to help Muslim children and families discover Jesus in loving and gentle ways — through friendships, acts of kindness, Scripture, dreams, and courageous believers who share His love.

Your grown-ups are praying too — for churches to grow, for believers to be safe and strong, and for whole communities to encounter Jesus. And guess what? Your prayers matter too! When children pray, God listens.

As you go on this journey, remember: you are part of God’s big plan.

Every prayer you pray helps shine Jesus’ light into the Muslim world.



MORE ABOUT JUSTIN...

Justin was diagnosed with autism at two. He was unable to speak until five. He underwent 40 hours of therapy weekly. He was not accepted by 15 schools before finally finding one. At seven, his writing skill was assessed at just 0.1 percent, but his mother's efforts to teach him how to hold a pencil and write bore fruit. By eight, Justin's writing was published by a national publisher.

Despite his difficulties in speaking and the daily struggles with his autism, Justin uses his writing to inspire and encourage others worldwide, turning his challenges into a source of strength. One of the most exciting things we can remember as we pray is that Jesus is the Light of the World! His light shines in every place, even where there is darkness.


In John 8:12, Jesus said: “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.”

RANI HEARS ABOUT JESUS

(Medan, Indonesia)

In the warm, busy city of Medan in Indonesia, palm trees sway in the sunshine and motorbikes zoom past colourful markets filled with fruit and spices. The air smells of fried rice and sweet tea. Five times a day, the call to prayer echoes across the rooftops, reminding families to pause and pray.

Ten-year-old Rani loved helping her mother in their small food stall. Every morning, she stirred rice and curry while her mother greeted customers with a smile. Rani loved God. She prayed every day and tried to be kind. But she had never read the Bible, and she did not know very much about Jesus.

One afternoon, Rani's aunt invited her mother to a small women's reading group. "We are just reading stories about the prophets," her aunt explained. "Would you like to come?"

Rani's mother hesitated. But she was curious. So that evening, Rani and her mother walked together to her aunt's house.

The women sat on woven mats on the floor. A small book lay in the centre of the circle. They were not arguing. They were not debating. They were simply reading stories.

Rani listened quietly as they read about creation. They read about Abraham. They read about forgiveness and God's promises.

Then one evening, they began reading about Jesus. Rani leaned closer.

They read about His kindness. They read about His miracles. They read about how He forgave people and welcomed children. Rani felt something stir inside her heart, though she did not understand it fully.

That night, something unexpected happened. Rani's mother had a dream.

In the dream, a man dressed in shining white stood before her. His face was gentle, and His eyes were kind. There was nothing frightening about Him — only peace. "I am the Way," He said softly. "Follow Me."

Rani's mother woke up suddenly. Her heart was beating fast, but she felt calm. The dream felt more real than any she had ever had before.

The next day, she told Rani what had happened. "Do you think it was Jesus?" Rani whispered. Her mother nodded slowly. "I think He is revealing Himself to us."

Over the next few weeks, the women continued reading. They learned that Jesus is called the Lamb of God. They learned that He died and rose again. They learned that He forgives sins and gives new life.

Rani began praying differently.

Instead of repeating familiar words, she spoke honestly. "Jesus... if You are real... please show me."

She didn't hear a loud voice. She didn't see bright lights. But as she read the stories and prayed, she felt peace. She felt joy when she heard Jesus' words. She felt known — as if someone understood her completely.

One afternoon, Rani and her mother sat beside a narrow irrigation canal surrounded by green rice fields. A small group of women gathered quietly. One by one, they stepped into the water and were baptised as followers of Jesus.

Rani watched carefully. She saw tears. She saw smiles. She saw courage.

Later, Rani hugged her mother tightly. "We belong to Jesus now," she said.

Her mother smiled. "Yes. And He has shown Himself to us."

From that day on, Rani began praying for her friends at school. She didn't argue. She didn't force conversations. But when someone asked her why she seemed so joyful, she answered simply, "Because Jesus loves me." Rani learned something important:

Jesus reveals Himself to people who truly seek Him. And when He does, everything begins to change.

AYAAN LEARNS ABOUT PEACE

(Peshawar, Pakistan)

In the ancient city of Peshawar, tall mountains rise in the distance and busy markets fill the streets with colour and sound. People sell bright fabrics, spices, and sweet tea. The call to prayer echoes across rooftops five times each day.

Ten-year-old Ayaan loved cricket more than anything. Every afternoon, he played in the dusty lane outside his home with his cousins and neighbours.

Ayaan had always been taught to respect his elders and protect his family. But he had also heard something else — that Christians were different and not to be trusted.

One day, a new family moved into the house at the end of the street. They were followers of Jesus.

At first, everyone kept their distance.

One afternoon, while playing cricket, Ayaan slipped while chasing the ball. He fell hard and scraped his knee badly. The cut was deep, and he began to cry.

Before his cousins could help him, someone else ran toward him.

It was Uncle Rahim — the Christian neighbour.

He knelt beside Ayaan, washed the wound carefully with clean water, and wrapped it gently with cloth. “You will be okay,” he said kindly.

Ayaan was surprised. He had expected distance. Instead, he found kindness.

Over the next few weeks, Uncle Rahim greeted Ayaan’s father politely each morning. His wife shared homemade bread with neighbours. Their children played respectfully with others.

One evening, during a power cut, Ayaan’s father accepted an invitation to sit outside with Uncle Rahim’s family for tea. They talked about work, about family, about the challenges of raising children.

Eventually, Ayaan’s father asked a question.

“Why are you always so peaceful?”

Uncle Rahim smiled gently. “Because Jesus teaches us to love, even when it is difficult.”

Ayaan listened carefully.

Months passed. Conversations continued. There were no arguments — only honest questions.

Ayaan’s father began reading stories about Jesus. He discovered that Jesus forgave His enemies and prayed for those who hurt Him.

One night, Ayaan’s father said quietly to his family, “If Jesus brings this kind of peace, I want Him to lead our home.”

The change was not loud. It was steady.

Arguments became shorter. Forgiveness became quicker. Their home felt lighter.

Now, when Ayaan plays cricket, he sometimes invites the Christian children first.

He has learned something important:

Peace is not weakness.

Peace is strength that comes from Jesus.

And he prays that his whole city will know that peace too.



YOUSSEF DISCOVERS JESUS' POWER

(Marrakech, Morocco)

Marrakech is a city of warm sunshine, red walls, and busy streets. In the old part of the city, narrow lanes twist like a maze. Donkeys pull carts of oranges and mint. People sell bright lanterns, leather bags, and sweet pastries dusted with sugar. At night, the air fills with the sound of drums and the smell of grilled food from market stalls.

Ten-year-old Youssef loved going with his father to the market. He loved watching the snake charmers and listening to stories from older boys who acted brave and bold.

But sometimes Youssef didn't feel brave inside.

Some nights, he had troubling dreams. Sometimes he felt a heavy worry in his chest, even when nothing bad had happened. He didn't know how to explain it, so he kept it to himself.

One afternoon, Youssef's aunt came to visit. She brought his cousin, Samira, who was about Youssef's age. Samira was cheerful and calm, the kind of person who smiled easily.

When the grown-ups talked, Youssef and Samira played on the rooftop where they could see the city stretching out into the distance.

Samira noticed Youssef was quieter than usual.

"Are you okay?" she asked gently.

Youssef shrugged. "Sometimes I feel... bothered. Like I can't relax."

Samira nodded as if she understood. Then she said something surprising.

"When I feel like that, I talk to Jesus."

Youssef blinked. "Jesus?"

Samira looked around to make sure nobody was nearby, then whispered, "Yes. My mother follows Jesus. We read Bible stories together. Jesus is strong. He helps us."

Youssef didn't know what to say. He had heard the name of Jesus before, but not like this — not as someone who helps.

That evening, as the call to prayer echoed across the rooftops, Samira's mother came upstairs with a small book wrapped in cloth. She smiled kindly at Youssef.

"Would you like to hear a story?" she asked.

Youssef nodded, curious.

She opened the book carefully and read about Jesus calming a storm. The disciples were in a boat, waves crashing all around

them. They thought they might drown. But Jesus spoke, and the storm became still.

Youssef listened closely. He imagined the wind and the waves... and then quiet.

Samira's mother looked at him. "Jesus is not afraid. He has authority."

That night, Youssef lay in bed thinking about the story. When his usual worry started to rise, he tried something new.

He whispered, "Jesus... if You are real... help me."

Nothing dramatic happened. No bright lights. No loud sounds.

But a calm peace settled over him, like a warm blanket.

Over the next few days, Youssef couldn't stop thinking about Jesus. When Samira's family visited again, Youssef asked for another story. Then another.

He learned that Jesus healed the sick. He forgave sins. He welcomed children. He spoke with kindness and power.

One afternoon, Youssef admitted something to Samira.

"I want to know Jesus like you do."

Samira grinned. "You can."

They sat together on the rooftop. Samira helped Youssef pray. It wasn't fancy. It was simple.

"Jesus... I want to belong to You. Please help me. Please forgive me. Please lead me."

Youssef felt tears come into his eyes, and he didn't even know why. He just felt... lighter. Like a heavy backpack had been taken off his shoulders.

From then on, when the troubling feelings returned, Youssef prayed again. And he kept reading the Bible stories with Samira's family whenever they could.

Sometimes, Youssef drew pictures of the stories — a boat on waves, Jesus with His hand raised, the sea becoming calm. He kept the drawings hidden in his school bag and looked at them when he needed courage.

Youssef began to understand something important:

Jesus is stronger than anything that troubles our hearts.

And when we call on Him, He answers.




(Niamey, Niger)

Niamey is a city beside the wide Niger River. The sun can be very hot, and the streets can feel dusty and bright. People sell mangoes and peanuts at roadside stalls. Motorbikes buzz past, and goats sometimes wander near the markets as if they own the place.

Nine-year-old Mariama lived in a neighbourhood where everyone knew everyone. She helped her mother fetch water, swept the courtyard, and watched her little brother while her mother cooked.

Mariama was a careful observer. She noticed small things: who shared food, who kept their door open, who helped an elderly neighbour carry a heavy bag.

A new family arrived in the neighbourhood one month before the rainy season. They came from another country and spoke with a different accent. They were friendly, but they didn't act like tourists. They stayed. They learned local words. They greeted people respectfully.

Mariama watched them closely.

The mother, Mrs. Hana, often carried a large bag of supplies and walked to visit women in the neighbourhood. Sometimes Mariama saw her sit with a neighbour whose baby was sick. Sometimes she helped cook. Sometimes she swept someone's courtyard without being asked.

One day Mariama asked her mother, "Why does she help so much?"

Her mother shrugged. "Some people like to do good things."

But Mariama noticed something else.

When Mrs. Hana helped, she didn't show off. She didn't make a big noise. She didn't act like she was more important.

She served like it was normal. Like it was joyful.

One afternoon, Mariama's little brother spilled a pot of water. It splashed everywhere, and Mariama felt her face burn with frustration. Water was heavy to carry, and now they would have to fetch more.

Mariama's mother sighed. "It's okay," she said, but Mariama could tell she was tired.

Just then, Mrs. Hana walked past the gate. She paused, saw the wet ground, and asked kindly, "May I help?"

Before Mariama could answer, Mrs. Hana was already lifting the bucket and helping clean the mess. She smiled at Mariama and said, "Don't worry. Everyone makes mistakes."

Mariama couldn't stop thinking about it.

Later, Mariama saw Mrs. Hana sitting under a tree with a few women. They weren't arguing. They were talking gently. Mariama heard one word repeated: Isa — Jesus.

"I heard your mother is sick," she said softly. "May I visit?"

Layla smiled. "Yes."


She told Noor about Jesus welcoming children. She told her about the shepherd who looks for the lost sheep. She told her about forgiveness.





